

Through School Fuel, Hope community has the opportunity to show God's love in our schools and be the hands and feet of Jesus. School Fuel is a ministry that attempts to address the issue of food scarcity for children who arrive at school hungry. Breakfast is served to nearly 350 kids each morning at the following schools: Wheatland Elementary, Brentwood Elementary, Westmount Elementary, George Freeman School, Trinity Christian Academy, Crowther Junior High, Strathmore High School and the Strathmore Outreach School. Each morning students receive a breakfast of a muffin, cheese, and fruit – (we bake nearly 4000 muffins every two weeks!) The program is funded by grants and donations made by companies and individuals. Breakfast Club of Canada has also given us funds to help offset some of these costs. Huge thanks to the hard work of more than 40 volunteers that bake, serve, wash bins, pick up and deliver muffins, and shop. 
Vision Casting: As we move forward, we recognize the need to do some vision casting to align our community with our spiritual and organizational goals.
